- 4 Delivered £1,5million investment into Patchway **Community Centre** and over £700,000 into **new sports facilities** at Norman Scott Park

for Cribbs Causeway

Cribbs Causeway is changing as new employers move here and new homes are built. We have listened to our fellow residents in Cribbs Causeway, held street meetings and campaigned for action to improve residents' lives. We have:

- 2 Delivered measures to prevent rat-running on Passage Road
- 3 Delivered pedestrian crossings at A4018 for bus users

- 6 Fought for and delivered signal review and implementation of yellow box at Lysander Road. Taken action on Potholes – working with you to identify them, and getting them on the schedule for repair.
